General Principles



Site Initiative Application for Resource Support General Principles:

The YOR4Good Fund is intended to deliver social, economic and environmental benefits in the area covered by the YORhub Frameworks through the provision of grants and/or benefit in kind of up to £10,000 to support small scale projects.

The purpose of this application form is to enable organisations to apply and be considered for resource support (not cash grants) by YORhub Contractors that are delivering projects in their area.

1. Site Initiatives are a means of delivering community projects, utilising resources donated by a YORhub Contractor appointed to either the YORbuild or YORcivil Frameworks. These must be delivered by a YORhub Contractor and honour commitments they made to deliver Social Value outcomes when they tendered for a place on these Frameworks.
2. Site Initiatives are not a means of receiving a cash grant but are intended to take advantage of resources that are delivering a YORhub Framework construction project nearby. Contractors will donate resources in the form of labour, materials or plant from their own firm or their supply chain, often known as Benefit in Kind, as an alternative to making a cash donation. This can be a very efficient way of delivering a community project as resources are often on hand and can take advantages of economies of scale, savings in mobilisation costs or spare/surplus resources.
3. YORhub runs separate time limited campaigns to provide cash grants once or twice per year dependant on the availability of funds. Information about these campaigns can be obtained by emailing stan.brown@eastriding.gov.uk.
4. Organisations can apply for resource support in two ways:
 - a. you may be approached/sponsored by a YORhub Contractor, and the Contractor will submit a Contractor Site Initiative application for approval to support your project, or
 - b. you can complete this form without being sponsored and submit it to stan.brown@eastriding.gov.uk.
5. For a Contractor Site Initiative application, if the Contractors submission meets the eligibility and outcome requirements and scores 50 marks or more it will be forwarded to the YOR4Good Panel Chair and if approved can then proceed.
6. For an unsponsored application (i.e., Site Initiative Application for Resource Support), if your submission meets the eligibility and outcome requirements and scores 50 marks or more it will be forwarded to the YOR4Good Panel Chair and if approved, the Framework Contractors will be invited to support

your application. Framework Contractors have up to 3 months to adopt an unsponsored application after which time it will expire. The YOR4Good Co-ordinators will attempt to find a sponsor for each project during this 3 month period, but acceptance isn't guaranteed. Site Initiative Applications for Resource Support that have failed to attract a sponsor may be resubmitted after 6 months from the expiry date.

7. If a Site Initiative project is adopted by a Framework Contractor, it must be completed within 21 days of the completion of the associated construction project. There are also other conditions that organisations must agree to in order for their project to be supported, such as committing to providing progress updates and a case study on completion etc. A copy of these terms and conditions are available on request by emailing stan.brown@eastriding.gov.uk.
8. The maximum equivalent value of Benefit in Kind resource support is £10,000 unless there are exceptional circumstances. If such exceptional circumstances arise, then these must be notified to the YOR4Good Panel by emailing stan.brown@eastriding.gov.uk.
9. Organisations who have received resource support from YORhub (or a separate cash grant) will generally have to wait 2 years before they can apply again.
